
























TEXTILE VALUE CHAIN

Highly Successful India ITME-2016

1100 Exhibitors, 38 Countries, 17 Chapters, 11 Exhibiting Halls, 41 Product Launches over 6 days period of exhibition made India ITME-2016 the largest and apex exhibition for Textile machinery and Technology in India. A total of 1,17,000 footfall from 74 countries visited India ITME-2016. The total number of exhibitors in this exhibition were 1100 out of which 60% were Indian companies & 40% foreign participants. The new countries which participated first time in Indian exhibition are Israel, Malaysia, Norway, & Portugal. The largest participation in terms of total number of companies & total number of area booked are China, Italy, Germany, Turkey, Switzerland & Japan.

New product launches such as, Spinit 3.0 E with optional Fancy Module device, Chenille Yarn Machine, Tread Winding Machine, Super Auto Levellor Drawframe drew visitors from all textile hubs.



Planet Textiles 2017 to take place in Bangalore, India



Planet Textiles, the leading annual summit on environmental issues for the global textile sector will take place on Wednesday 24th May at the JW Marriott Hotel in Bangalore, India. This leading, independent, textile industry event, will once again be co-organised by

Last year the event took place in Copenhagen and attracted around 450 senior industry executives and speakers from brands such as VF Corporation, Nike, Marks & Spencer, Puma, Gap, Levi Strauss, along with many others. Due to the influential nature of Planet Textiles the event also draws interest from NGOs and policymakers. Last year senior representatives from the German, Danish, and Honduran Governments were present in Copenhagen, this included Juan Orlando Hernandez, the President of Honduras.

"Planet Textiles is the leading international event on sustainability in the textile sector because it discusses real-world practical issues and ideas on how the global supply chain can move to a more sustainable future," said Scott Miller, Director, Business Development at the Sustainable Apparel Coalition. "The event last year was a huge success with nearly 450 delegates from 33 countries and featured some inspirational presentations from industry leaders, along with tangible outcomes."
